The Main Hall is lined with photographic essays featuring historic City Island bridges and buildings, the America's Cup, Hart Island history, a timeline, a model of a minesweeper and images of other military vessels built on City Island, and a handsome wooden kayak built in the 1930s.

The Sail Making Gallery includes designs, tools, materials, sail bags, as well as flags, banners, signs, and photographs of legendary City Island sailmakers.

The Walsh Library features a collection of maritime history books, newspaper clippings, postcards, and photographs of City Island places and people. It holds an extensive selection of nautical magazines, a database of all boats built on City Island since 1848, an impressive display of ship models, and an oral history video on City Island history.

Shipyards, sail lofts, yachts, and the people behind them are all honored in the **Nautical Room**.

Celebrating City Islanders, the **Community Room** displays photos, maps, and memorabilia, including Native American arrowheads found in the area and a Revolutionary War cannonball.

The original principal's office is set up like a traditional **School Room** with exhibits of student registers, graduation pictures, the old school bell, artifacts giving the history of City Island's schools, as well as a navigation exhibit and unique map of Pelham Bay Park's WWI naval training station.
